

Conducted focus groups across the country.

Nationally representative survey study of 2041 adults.

Conducted online interviews between August 15 and August 29, 2012.

Data collected by Harris Interactive Service Bureau (HISB).

HISB was responsible for data collection only.

Public Agenda & the GALEWill Center designed survey and analyzed data.










WHAT ONE WORD DESCRIBES THE AMERICAN DREAM?










DOES THE AMERICAN DREAM CHANGE OVER TIME?






Under 30s say their idea of the American Dream is different from the previous generation's Over 30s say their ideas about the Dream have changed since they were younger






WHERE DO AMERICANS BELIEVE THEY ARE IN ACHIEVING THE AMERICAN DREAM?







I have achieved the American Dream.



I am making progress on achieving the American Dream, but I still have a way to go.







Good transportation and communication systems so businesses and people can work efficiently


A government that creates opportunities for people to get ahead

Being well-connected to other successful people








WHICH CHILD IS MORE LIKELY TO ACHIEVE THE AMERICAN DREAM?








WHAT IS PLACING THE AMERICAN DREAM IN DANGER?

Even people with a strong work ethic and good values are becoming increasingly shut out from achieving the American Dream.




One of the major dangers to the American Dream is the decline of the a strong work ethic and values like honesty.





Good schools and teachers to insure that every child has a fair chance to get a good education




